

# Whose Report Do You Believe

## There's No god Like Jehovah Pt.2

*ESV Exodus 15:11 "Who is like you, O LORD, **among the gods**? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders?"*

Moses asks a legitimate question, "*who is like Jehovah among the "el" (the little "g" gods, mighty ones)?*"

Make no mistake about it, Moses is **not** talking about figures carved with men's hands!

**Moses is talking about the "mighty ones" who rebelled against God!**

*ESV Deuteronomy 32:17 They sacrificed to demons that were no gods, to gods they had never known, to new gods that had come recently, whom your fathers had never dreaded.*

They sacrificed to **demons/devils'** rebellious angels, mighty ones!

Demons or devils are "**bastard spirits**" because they are the illegitimate union between the Watchers and women.

Since they were conceived on earth they are bound to the earth, they roam looking for a body to inhabit!

As **bastard spirits** they are also called "**unclean spirits**" because in God's eyes they are an abomination a wicked perversion of His creation

*KJV Job 4:18 Behold, he put no trust in his servants; and his angels he charged with folly (error)*

*19 how much more those who dwell in houses of clay, whose foundation is in the dust, who are crushed like the moth.*

*KJV Jude 1:6 And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, he hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day.*

Angels, divine beings, and mighty ones can sin, they have free will!

They left their first "**arche**" original position of authority and their assigned places! Rebelled against God and turned upon mankind!

*KJV Psalm 103:20 Bless the LORD, ye his angels (messengers), that excel in strength (mighty ones), that do his commandments, hearkening unto the voice of his word.*

**Mighty Ones** are a high class of spiritual being also known as “**divine beings, watchers, and sons of God**”

*ESV Deuteronomy 32:7 Remember the days of old; consider the years of many generations; ask your father, and he will show you, your elders, and they will tell you.*

**8** *When the Most High gave to the nations their inheritance, when he divided mankind, he fixed the borders of the peoples according to the number of the sons of God.*

**9** *But the LORD's portion is his people, Jacob his allotted heritage.*

These are the **70 nations** that came from Noah's sons in **Gen 10**.  
(14 from Japheth, 26 from Shem and 30 from Ham)

**Jehovah** placed 70 Watchers over these nations to teach and train the ways of God, they rebelled and taught men to worship them.

*KJV Daniel 4:17 This matter is by the decree of the watchers, and the demand by the word of the holy ones: to the intent that the living may know that the most High ruleth in the kingdom of men, and giveth it to whomsoever he will, and setteth up over it the basest of men.*

Watchers were to be the teachers and guardians of The Truth!

*ESV Job 33:23 If there be for him an angel, a mediator, one of the thousand, to declare to man what is right for him...*

**The Book of The Watchers** as well as **The Book of Enoch** tells us the watchers who came down to have sex with women in **Gen 6** also taught women sorcery.

Where did mankind learn the many wicked things he does?

Where did false religions, forms of government and inventions come from?

*ESV Job 1:6 Now there was a day when the sons of God came to present themselves before the LORD, and Satan also came among them.*

Some Bible researchers say the 70 sons of God regularly reported to God of their activities among men and this was such a time.

Both in **Job 1:6 & 2:1** the sons (**Watchers**) report their activities and Satan comes also; God asks Satan each time what have you been up to?

God then chose the nation of Israel as His covenant people; they were to teach the nations of the world what Jehovah personally taught them.

*ESV Deuteronomy 32:12 the LORD alone guided him (Israel); no foreign god was with him.*

*Psalm 135:4 For the LORD hath chosen Jacob unto himself, and Israel for his peculiar treasure.*

The **Old Covenant (OT)** reveals God's steadfast love for His people and His (**immediate**) punishment for breaking His Covenant.

The **New Covenant (NT)** reveals God's steadfast love for His people; His (**delayed**) punishment (**blessing**) grace upon us until His plan is fulfilled.

*Jeremiah 7:25 From the day that your fathers came out of the land of Egypt to this day, I have persistently sent all my servants the prophets to them, day after day.*

*26 Yet they did not listen to me or incline their ear, but stiffened their neck. They did worse than their fathers.*

Because of their often rebellion God would use their enemies to punish them until they understood and repented.

Like when Sennacherib king of Assyria came to attack Jerusalem Rabshakeh the king's emissary said these words to Hezekiah king of Judah:

*GWN 2 Kings 18:19 He said to them, "Tell Hezekiah, 'This is what the great king, the king of Assyria, says: What makes you so confident?*

*20 You give useless advice about getting ready for war. Whom, then, do you trust for support in your rebellion against me?*

*21 Now, look! When you trust Egypt, you're trusting a broken stick for a staff. If you lean on it, it stabs your hand and goes through it. This is what Pharaoh (the king of Egypt) is like for everyone who trusts him.*

22 Suppose you tell me, "We're trusting the LORD our God." He's the god whose places of worship and altars Hezekiah got rid of. He told Judah and Jerusalem, "Worship at this altar in Jerusalem."

23 "Now, make a deal with my master, the king of Assyria. I'll give you 2,000 horses if you can put riders on them.

24 How can you defeat my master's lowest-ranking officers when you trust Egypt for chariots and horses?

25 "Have I come to destroy this place without the LORD on my side? The LORD said to me, 'Attack this country, and destroy it.'"

**Rabshakeh** was trying to convince Judah that Jehovah had abandoned them and became his ally, so they couldn't expect God's help!

26 Then Eliakim (son of Hilkiah), Shebna, and Joah said to the field commander, "Speak to us in Aramaic, since we understand it. Don't speak to us in the Judean language as long as there are people on the wall listening."

27 But the field commander asked them, "Did my master send me to tell these things only to you and your master? Didn't he send me to the men sitting on the wall who will have to eat their own excrement and drink their own urine with you?"

28 Then the field commander stood and shouted loudly in the Judean language, "Listen to the great king, the king of Assyria.

29 This is what the king says: Don't let Hezekiah deceive you. He can't rescue you from me.

30 Don't let Hezekiah get you to trust the LORD by saying, 'The LORD will certainly rescue us, and this city will not be put under the control of the king of Assyria.'

33 Did any of the gods (elohim) of the nations rescue their countries from the king of Assyria?

34 Where are the gods of Hamath and Arpad? Where are the gods of Sepharvaim, Hena, and Ivvah? Did they rescue Samaria from my control?

35 Did the gods of those countries rescue them from my control? Could the LORD then rescue Jerusalem from my control?"

Rabshakeh said none of the other gods was able to save their nations!

**Exodus 15:11** "Who is like you, O LORD, among the gods?"

**ESV Psalm 89:6** For who in the skies can be compared to the LORD? Who among the heavenly beings is like the LORD,

*7 a God greatly to be feared in the council of the holy ones, and awesome above all who are around him?*

*9 You rule the raging sea. When its waves rise, you quiet them.*

*10 You crushed **Rahab** like a carcass; you scattered your enemies with your mighty arm.*

**Rahab** was the god of chaos also known as “**Leviathan**”!

Words like “*ragging, chaos and seas*” are typically mentioned with this little g god, because “*storms*” over water cause chaos “**hurricanes**” that disrupt and destroy people’s lives.

**Chaos** is emptiness, disorder, and confusion!

**Confusion** is the violation of **Divine Order!** (Lev 18:23, Jam 3:16)

Jehovah **rules** the seas, He rules over **Rahab, Leviathan** the god of chaos.

*ESV Matthew 8:23* And when he got into the boat, his disciples followed him.

*24* And behold, there arose a **great storm on the sea**, so that the boat was being swamped by the waves; but he was asleep.

*25* And they went and woke him, saying, “Save us, Lord; we are perishing.”

*26* And he said to them, “*Why are you afraid, O you of little faith?*” Then **He rose** (became agitated) **and rebuked** (reprimand) **the winds and the sea**, and there was a **great calm**.

*27* And the men marveled, saying, “What sort of man is this, that even winds and sea obey him?”

This is **Jesus** proving there’s no God Like Jehovah!

Fulfilling the scriptures prophesied by Moses in **Ps 89:9-10**

Ruling over **Rahab, Leviathan** the god of chaos.

*9 You rule the raging sea. When its waves rise, you quiet them.*

Serious Bible students noticed Jesus and His disciples often being challenged by **storms—Leviathan the god of Chaos.**

This is more than nature acting violently, this is the god of Chaos trying to interrupt or stop God's plans for your life!

Jesus is reminding us **not** to give in to **chaos** when it enters our lives!

Again, after Jesus and the disciples fed 5000 men not counting women and children, He sends them off in a boat to another city.

If was taking too long because **the wind was against them** Jesus came to them **walking** on the sea.

The first time Jesus **talks** to the god of chaos, the second time Jesus **walks** on the god of chaos!

Jesus **walked** on the sea revealing His power over Leviathan, placing him under His feet. **Jesus tread on the sea as we tread on serpents...**

*Matthew 14:26* And when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were troubled, saying, It is a spirit; and they cried out for fear.

Ask yourself this question: since 1/3 of the disciples were fishermen, do you think a storm could have terrified them, no!

Do you also think they knew what a **spirit** is, yes!  
These weren't little children who believed in fairy tales Jesus chose!

These were strong wise, able bodied men who knew how destructive these storms were that popped up unexpectedly over the waters.

*ESV Matthew 14:27* But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "**Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid.**"

*28* And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water."

Peter knew this was **not** a regular storm.

Peter said "*if this is you Jesus, **order** or **command** me to come to you on the water!*"

Peter understood there was a "storm god" a god who controlled the seas but that Jesus had authority over **Rahab/Leviathan**.

If Jesus commanded him to come, there was nothing **Rahab** could do!

Peter learned from their first encounter back in **Matt 8** which happened around **November of AD 27**.

This next encounter in **Matt 14** happened **5 months** later!

❖ Peter knows Jesus has power over **chaos** when it invades his life!

*Matthew 14:29* Jesus said, "**Come**." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus.

*30* But when he saw the wind boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink, he cried, saying, Lord, save me.

The first encounter with **Leviathan** Jesus spoke to it and it obeyed, the second time Jesus walks on it and it submitted.

The third encounter Jesus allows Peter to walk on the god of chaos!

Again, do you think **Peter** a professional fisherman was afraid of wind?

No, what Peter saw wasn't just wind, the scripture says Peter **perceived** the wind, he saw something in the wind and knew what it was **Chaos**, **Leviathan** the storm god ready to destroy him and he was afraid!

*Matthew 14:31* Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "**O you of little faith, why did you doubt?**"

*32* And when they got into the boat, the wind ceased.

*33* Then they that were in the ship came and worshipped him, saying, Of a truth thou art the Son of God.

*KJV 1 Corinthians 14:33* For God is not the author of **(disorder)** confusion, but of **(harmony)** peace, as in all churches of the saints.

*Psalm 86:8* Among the gods there is none like unto thee, O Lord; neither are there any works like unto thy works.
